A definition of the terms used in phonics

Phoneme

A single sound made by a letter or group of letters.

Grapheme

A letter or group of letters that represent a sound in a word.

Trigraph

Three letters that together make one sound such as 'igh' in 'night'.

Digraph

Two letters that together make one sound such as 'ch' in 'chip'.

Blending

The process of saying the individual sounds that make up a word and then merging them together to say the word.

Split digraph

A long vowel sound that has been split like in the words make, tale and like.

CVC word

A word that is made up of a consonant sound, a vowel sound and another consonant sound, such as 'c-a-t' or 'sh-o-p'.

'Harder to Read and Spell' word

A common word that is difficult to sound out using simple phonics, such as 'the'.

Decoding

The process of using phonic knowledge to read words.

Segmenting

The process of splitting up the individual sounds that make up a word to help with spelling.

High Frequency Word

A word that occurs frequency in speech and writing such as 'and'.
